GUIDELINES FOR BOOK REVIEWS

1. Reviews should be submitted in German or English as an e-mail attachment in Microsoft Word, Word for Macintosh, or Rich Text Format (rtf) to [jmoser@washjeff.edu](mailto:jmoser@washjeff.edu), and should include the reviewer's name, affiliation, and e-mail address. **The deadline is always 3 months from the date the book was shipped to the reviewer** unless other arrangements have been made with the editors.

2. The review should be **approximately 900 words**, roughly 3–4 pages double-spaced. Longer reviews may be returned for revision. In some cases longer reviews or review articles may be accepted upon consultation with the editors.

3. At the beginning of the review please include the author/editor, title/subtitle, series/edition, place of publication, publisher, year, pages.

Examples: Wendelin Schmidt-Dengler, Johann Sonnleitner, and Klaus Zeyringer, Hrsg., *Komik in der österreichischen Literatur*. Philologische Studien und Quellen 142. Berlin: Erich Schmidt, 1996. 308 S.

Sander Gilman, *Franz Kafka, the Jewish Patient*. New York: Routledge, 1995. 328 pp.

4. Type your name and your institution at the end of the review:

5. Reviews should **briefly summarize** the book's theses and conclusions. The bulk of the review should **evaluate** the book critically, including comparisons, if appropriate, to other important work in the field. Evaluative comments should be supported by **brief but sufficient evidence**. Factual errors should be corrected, but typographical errors should not be listed or corrected in the review.

Please do not use footnotes. Keep quotations brief. **All direct quotations should be accompanied by page numbers.**

6. The editors of the journal reserve the right to make minor editorial changes for clarity, style, or brevity. They also reserve the right, after consulting the reviewer, not to publish reviews deemed unsuitable or excessively late.
